

Amanda's sister knew she would have to miss the concert, and she was able to gather close to a dozen staff members to help surprise her. They all gathered in Amanda's room and sang a few hit songs like "I Want It That Way" and "Everybody (Backstreet's Back)."

In an interview with "Good Morning America," Amanda said that this really lifted her spirits. "I can honestly say the nurses at Northside Hospital are the best."

To make things even more exciting for Amanda, her sister tweeted a video of the nurses singing to her sister, and one of the Backstreet Boys, Nick Carter, shared the footage on his page and wrote:
