Not permitted to drive at any time if taking narcotics, sedatives, Ativan®, or Benadryl®. Regardless of time period, not permitted to drive to and from clinic/hospital on the day of a procedure (i.e. bone marrow aspirate biopsy, blood transfusion, colonoscopy/endoscopy, surgical procedure, bone marrow harvest, intravenous chemotherapy) if procedure or treatment includes administration of narcotics, sedatives or Benadryl®.					
Still need 24/7 caregiver?	May ask MD after 100 days post BMT. Dependent on discharge from clinic, current medications and patient status
